It is not that having ideas from study and reflection are not important; they are critical, but today in our modern world, we need to be able to deliver on the directive of Christ to go into all the world and proclaim Christ and see people 'actually' come to faith.

It is not good enough to just talk about it.

I do not believe I have the right to speak on how to share faith or the credibility to ask for support if I cannot point specifically to the people who have come to a new or renewed faith in God. Because of this faith, their lives are transformed very practically in how they live.

By God's merciful grace, I can point to thousands of people, some whom I have met and many I have never seen with my own eyes who now declare Christ as their savior.

I realise that this is a bold statement, but the reason I can be so bold is that an Archbishop asked me this question years ago, "Show me who has come to Christ and His Church from what you have done. Tell me their names. Others tell me they proclaim Christ, but no one can tell me anyone's names."

It is a good, proper, and right question to ask.


The following is a very brief overview of how to proclaim Christ. It is in part story; in other places it is technical and leads to the future.

Bruce Downes has a charism, by which I mean the gift given by God through an individual and through the Church but given to the world. Add to this his formidable powers of organisation and networking and you have the potent mix that has become the Catholic Guy.

As far as I can see the hand of God is upon Bruce Downes, who shows what it means for all the baptized to live their vocation to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ. I commend him to you and to the grace of the Lord Jesus who has led him to this point and who will, I pray, continue to lead him into the future.

We seek to share faith with those who do not connect with God and the Church while at the same time enriching the lives of those who live the Gospel in their life.

Our world is becoming more secular, that is godless, and the effects of this can be seen in the lives of our friends, spouses, children, family, those we know and even ourselves. Many people are no longer looking or even giving thought to how to connect with God in their life, yet the mysterious questions of life, its limited nature, and what is to come are before us all.

People need help to find God.

The times in which we live require bold, new and complementary ways of proclaiming the essential message of the Gospel in the modern world.

The richness of the 'Message' of the Church commissioned by Christ to declare His love for all of humankind must be preserved, while at the same time presented in fresh and new ways according to the Popes and Church in recent decades. New, however, does not mean throwing out the old, for that is to lose who we are, what we have, how we have come to understand God, and how He acts in our lives. Instead, in these modern and changing times, it is finding new words, images, stories and ways to declare the love of God.

How can people respond if they do not hear and connect with those who will tell of God?

But how are they to call on one in whom they have not believed?

And how are they to believe in one of whom they have never heard?

And how are they to hear without someone to proclaim him?

Romans 10:14

If we are to be obedient to Christ and reach people to come to faith, we have to 'go' to them. It is not an option, it is an imperative. We must go to them just as Jesus traveled from place to place.

"Let us go on to the neighboring towns, so that I may proclaim the message there also; for that is what I came out to do."

Media and modern communications in their many forms make this possible in ways we could not have imagined some years ago. No longer are we limited by Church walls as the message of the Gospel can be heard and seen on people's computers, televisions and on their devices that they carry with them everywhere they go. We can share Christ with more people today than at any time in human history.

In these pages, you will read the stories of what God has done in people's lives. Some people who were far away from God have come into a relationship with God. Some have joined the Church for the first time of their own decision. Many have returned to the sacraments in some way. Others have felt disconnected, even though they attend Church regularly, who have now found a deeper connection to God and their faith.



Now, growing in faith for the first time, couple's marriages have been strengthened and many troubled marriages restored. Today many children enjoy a peaceful and safe family environment where once it was not, as their parents have come to faith.

For others, a new or renewed faith has caused them to engage in lifetime dreams, whether they are older or younger to build businesses, pursue new careers and be successful in life's journey as they now go in the direction God beckons for them.

These are just some of the ways the Gospel has affected people's lives and those around them through this ministry. There are thousands of stories of people coming to or growing in faith without exaggeration. When Christ is a part of someone's life, it practically affects their relationships, values and the way they live and love.

This has all happened because we and our partners have done as Jesus commanded in the Great Commission and 'Gone Out' and reached people where they are. It is then that many people connect in some manner to local faith communities and become valued members of that community of faith.

Modern media allows us to reach people personally and importantly privately concerning their life and faith.

Sharing faith with those we love can sometimes be very difficult. We may think my son or daughter, husband or wife, a friend will not respond but that is where we must not forget it is God who works in people's lives.

For our loved ones and people we know, to encounter Christ, we have to 'Go Out' beyond our Church walls. We need to literally put the Message of the Gospel where people are so that they will freely come across it and experience the prompting of the Holy Spirit to stop, look, listen and respond.

I repeat, we have to put the Message of the Gospel in places where people will come across it, and this is not inside our Church walls alone but out in the world with all of its noise, busyness, distractions and activity.

By going out, we are literally casting seed, some of which will die where it lands, some will sprout for a moment and then be drowned out by the noise of the world, while criticism and ridicule will be enough to kill a budding shoot of faith.

Despite all this, some seed will fall in a fertile heart that is ready.

What is critical is that we must cast seed. We must. We must. It is not wasted effort or wasted resource, and it is to be like Jesus who did exactly the same.

There are certain times when people are more open to God, whether it be through something happening in their life such as a marriage, graduation, new job, retirement or through some of life's hardships or through a particular season such as Lent, Christmas or the start of the new year. It can be these times where a person is more open and therefore searching to answer the deeper questions in their life.

I am inviting you to help us reach people through these 'critical' peak times and together help us put the Message of Christ in places it will be found.

There are three ways that you can be part of this work of reaching out.

- 1. You can join us in prayer. It is the starting place and it is critical.


THE CALL TO PROCLAIM

Consequently, an evangelizer must never look like someone who has just come back from a funeral! Let us recover and deepen our enthusiasm, that "delightful and comforting joy of evangelizing, even when it is in tears that we must sow ... And may the world of our time, which is searching, sometimes with anguish, sometimes with hope, be enabled to receive the good news not from evangelizers who are dejected, discouraged, impatient or anxious, but from ministers of the Gospel whose lives glow with fervour, who have first received the joy of Christ."


I am 70+, and if I had heard this in my twenties maybe my life would have turned out very differently. But, better late than never!

Section 2: How did it begin?

HOW I CAME TO FAITH



I came that you might have life and have it to the full. John 10:10

This ministry came about because of a journey and calling that I experienced after a Discalced Carmelite priest named Fr Des Williamson shared the love of Christ with me in a manner I understood when I was a teenager. He showed me step by step how to respond to God and exemplified to me a life dedicated to Christ. He loved the Church and the Scriptures, and he passed that love onto me.

My siblings and my fellow class members from the Catholic schools I attended, on the whole, were ceasing participation in Church as the years went by.

The values of society seemed to speak to them more than Christ and the richness of the Church that I had been introduced to.

The world

Within a couple of years, all I could hear in my conscience was an urging to share this faith with others and find ways to do so that the modern person would hear and respond to it.

'Proclaim My glory to the ends of the earth,' were the words that kept coming to me as a young man when I prayed. I simply could not get past this phrase, but how could I do that?

For a number of years, I worked for the Archdiocese of Perth in Australia, a far-off place to most places in the world.

It was over years that Godly Bishops and priests within the Church encouraged me in this calling to proclaim Christ, to study, and find new and different ways of proclaiming Christ that would penetrate into the world and were completely faithful to the teaching of the Church and its tradition.

This led to years of trial and experimenting. I could write volumes on what I have tried and failed with my team along the way.

GOD GATHERS A TEAM

Over time, God would gather an amazing group of men and women around this calling to Proclaim Christ. They are leaders, pastoral people, musicians, those in production, administration and others. They live in different countries, cities and towns. For many of them, it is not an occupation but a calling and they live it with great dedication and sacrifice.

God Leads by the Doors He Opens and the Doors He Closes

In August 2006, my wife Rosemary and I visited the Vatican in Rome. We went as tourists. At the end of the one day, I felt compelled for some reason to return the next day, but this time to pray.



It was an urge I knew I had to respond to. To my absolute shock and surprise, by the end of that day, I felt God put on my heart an urge to make a Catholic television program. It made no sense at all to me. I knew nothing about television, had never been on television and, besides that, I thought, 'aren't only good-looking people on television,' which was something no one has ever suggested about me, except maybe my mother.

It is too long a story to tell here but God had a plan and the years of research and trial would come together to make this possible. Meetings with television people whom I did not know miraculously occurred and before I knew it we were starting a television program under the guidance of Archbishop Barry Hickey who was the Bishop responsible for media for the national Bishops Conference. This then led to parish mission events that touched the lives of thousands of people in cities and towns.

The ministry started being called, 'The Catholic Guy' as people would approach me having seen me somewhere and ask, 'Are you that Catholic Guy?' The canon lawyer who named the television program thought 'The Catholic Guy' was a good name, as did the executives at the television channel.

Unbeknown to me, in time, the television program would be seen in the United States of America and I was asked if I would bring the program to the USA. After much discernment, we agreed and the program was released in the USA.

Little did I know what would happen. In addition to television this led to an online ministry that now proclaims the Gospel in countries all over the world.

Section 3: How do we get heard?

WHY THE CHURCH IS NOT HEARD

Proclaiming Christ today demands new ways of sharing faith are adopted and, most critically, that the modern person is understood and respected.

People now come to truth and faith today differently than they did just a few decades ago.

One of the reasons for this is that people under forty years of age, and even more so for teenagers and young adults, are not hearing what the Church is saying because the Church speaks in a manner from a past era. Its language, in terms of images, examples and feel are often not relevant.

Put simply, we might describe it this way.

If we to go back only forty years ago, 'truth' was given to us. People believed more quickly what parents, guardians and authority figures in society as well as the Church had to say. There were norms, standards and values that people held to because that is what had happened in the past.

This does not mean people did not wrestle with authority, but their fight or argument was for different reasons than it is now.

Today, we do not care so much that a child knows that two times two equals four, so much as they know how to use the technology to get the right answer.

There are exams both at school and at university where you do not have to get the right answer, but rather, show why you think what you think and if you argue your case well then you will get a good grade.

The fact that it might be right or wrong does not matter.

The reason for this is that a slow change has occurred over the past few decades. The underlying value in society today is, 'do whatever you want as long as you are not hurting anyone. Your rights, your thoughts are supreme.'

In other words, we have all become the arbiter of our own truth today. The world is saying to us that what you believe and want to do is ok.

Now, on the one hand, we can argue that it is right to respect the individual, but when that opinion comes up against truth that is 'unchangeable' there is a problem.

There are two kinds of truth; Subjective and Objective Truth.

Subjective Truth is based on what we individually believe to be true. Simply, we might say it is our opinion.

Objective Truth, on the other hand, is truth that is outside of ourselves because it is fact. It is true no matter whether you believe it or not, what culture you are from or what time you live in.

For example, a Subjective Truth is that my sports team is the best team regardless of whether it wins the trophy because it just is. It is not based on fact but on opinion and feeling.

An example of an Objective Truth is that a person cannot stay alive long-term underwater unaided. They will die. It does not matter whether a person agrees with this or not. It is true regardless of personal opinion.

Christian belief, on the whole, is regarded as Objective Truth. It is true regardless of whether a person agrees with it or not. However, the values of the world are subjective when it comes to faith.

For example, the Scriptures and the Church tells us that there are three persons in the Trinity; The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. This is an Objective Truth.

Younger people, when told this, because of education and conditioning from within society, have one response on the whole and it is this:

"I am glad you think that. Let me think about it and I will tell you if I agree."

The individual is the arbiter of truth.

So often in Church, the way we are presenting truth is to tell it as absolute, which it is to those who believe, but for the person not able to comprehend this because of education and the values of society their only response must be to reject the Church and its message.

They do this by not participating and blocking their ears to voices that do not speak to them with respect.

"I get a lot of spiritual insight out of this man of God.
I used to be Catholic. I made my Holy Communion and
Confirmation when I was a child.

If I would have had gotten this kind of teaching, then, I would never have left the Catholic Church.



HOW PEOPLE RECEIVE FAITH TODAY

We need to include these ways when we share the Message of the Gospel with the modern person:

- 1. **STUDY& OBSERVATION:** It is essential to embrace the change in communicating and presentation style that is required today to share faith. This means we must study how people are trained and conditioned to think and hear in our modern world. When we understand this, we can develop our ways of communicating and be far more personal.
- 2. CONVICTION: It is imperative that the communicator/preacher/evangelist is deeply and overtly convicted about their faith and presents it as such. The whole time they are saying to the person they are speaking to, "this is me. This is what I believe and hold to be true." This conviction and certainty are vital because this is precisely how people in the world are trained and conditioned where they are also saying this is what I believe and who I am. So often, we Catholics are apologetic for our conviction. People today are conditioned to everyone having their strong opinions.
- 3. LOVE & RESPECT: It is imperative that the communicator of faith has a deep love of people regardless of their faith position and whether they agree with you or not. The bottom line is, 'do we love them enough to want them to have the faith we bear and not just the opinions we have.' It is not their fault necessarily that they do not believe. It could be the case that no one has ever loved them enough to go to the effort to share it in a manner that they can understand.
- 4. MAKE THE CHURCH'S ARGUMENT: Share what the Church's teaching is for your belief as expressed through the Tradition and Scripture in as relatable a way as you can. Remember most people are not trained in Church academics but in their field of expertise. When you have shared walk away. When you have shared walk away.
- 5. MAKE YOUR ARGUMENT: Present your personal reasons for what you believe but do not expect that the person listening will respond positively and accept your position just because you said it. Give solid, informed reasons for your faith and walk away.

- 6. TELL YOUR STORIES: Be prepared to share your life through your stories. Tell of your personal encounter with God. Why you believe. What difference it has made to you. This requires vulnerability and honesty. When you have done this walk away.
- 7. SHARE YOUR CONVICTION: By making your argument and telling your stories you are sharing your beliefs and the convictions that you carry. This is what affects a person's life as they come face to face with a person of faith who is most often a person just like them. Someone who is frail and very human and yet deeply convicted of who God is for them and for all of humanity. This conviction leads them to ask the subjective question, "do I want this is for my life." Once you have shared this walk away.
- 8. WALK AWAY BECAUSE YOU CARE: Walk away means having presented all the evidence that we can, for our belief, and having shown our conviction and told our intimate personal stories, we then need to leave the person to their thoughts and the processing of what has been presented to them. All of this can take months or longer to do. The reason for 'walking away' is that this is how people process thought and come to believe in the modern world.
- **9. THE HOLY SPIRIT:** By giving people space we need to pray that the Holy Spirit works in the person's heart, mind and spirit. We are not the one who brings about conversion. God brings about conversion. We are simply the evangeliser, ushering people toward God.
- 11. STAY CLOSE, WITNESS & REPEAT: Stay close to the person you are sharing with so that they can hear again and again from you not just by your words as you go forward but by the 'sound' of your actions. For most people, one sharing is not enough.
- **12. PRAY:** It is God who changes hearts and He holds them precious to Him because of His love.

ELEMENTS OF PROCLAMATION

It is essential to understand how a person comes to faith and what we need to do to maximize the potential for conversion or renewal within a person's life. As Christians, the center of our lives as seen in this diagram is our **FAITH** in God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. This diagram outlines the elements and steps concerning how to bring about conversion or how to bring renewal into a person's FAITH life whether they attend Church regularly or have dropped away from active participation or have not believed in the past.

To come to this faith, a person must be able to;

- 1. Talk Directly and Honestly to God
- 2. Forgive Others and Themselves
- 3. Accept Themselves

Conversion takes places within us at a;

- 1. Physical
- 2. Emotional
- 3. Spiritual level

The way to lead people to this conversion is through;

- 1. Movement
- Stories
- 3. A Pathway that shows them the way



MOVEMENT

is created within a person when the sharer of faith:

- Has Conviction. They are convinced for the person or people they are reaching because of what Christ has done in their life.
- Gives clear and meaningful instruction that causes the person to yield to Christ.
- In particular, the First Step is definite, specific and is meaningful to the person being reached.

PATHWAY

as a tool touch a person at an emotional level which helps them connect with their personal story. This is done through:

- Teaching a person that prayer, which is talking, listening and being in the presence of God is possible for them. This leads to:
- 2. Teaching or showing the person being reached a method of prayer that is achievable because it is in steps that they can do.
- The doorway to prayer is through vulnerability. It is saying to the person being reached this is how I relate to God. These are the blessings I experience and the struggles I have in prayer.

STORIES

concerns how a person relates or connects to God for the first time, when engaged in personal renewal or how they come back to faith after having fallen away in some form. This connection to God is achieved by the sharer of faith:

- Honesty, which may lead to tears as it touches the heart of a person.
- 2. Humor, which brings people face to face with the fragility of life and that when we try our best it can still fall short of our hopes and desires.
- Relatability helps a person find their story as they listen and can recognize the truth of what is said as it could have been them.



CHALLENGE OF SHARING FAITH


This diagram represents a scale of the receptivity of a person to God and Church. 10 is the point of personal belief.



In a past era reaching people who had dropped out of Church and their relationship with God was easier than it is now. We might say people were already 6 to 7 on a scale of 0 to 10 of receptiveness. If a Parish Mission was held or a Billy Graham evangelistic style event came to town it did not take much to get people re-involved again in their faith.



Today in the current era, receptivity to God is much lower. We might say it is a 2 to 3 on a scale of 0 to 10. When a Parish Mission or a Billy Graham evangelistic style event comes to town, it is far more rare to get a person to go from where they are to full re-involvement in their faith. The jump from where they are is just too great.



People tend to take small steps back to faith and not the giant leap from where they are as it is too great a jump. This requires an entirely different process of conversion and change. It takes time, and on the whole, the average Catholic is not equipped to know how to engage in this process and walk a person back into faith. This thwarts most of our efforts and greatly disheartens committed Christians in their outreach efforts.



If we can re-involve someone in their faith and they decide to become serious about it then what is quickly discovered is that they received the Sacraments before they were converted to believing and owning their faith for themselves. In other words they know very little. As is very commonly said in the USA, the Sacrament of Confirmation is the Sacrament of Exit.

Formation in the basics of faith becomes critical and this is not easy as any type of intellectual and heart transformation for the modern person takes time. It is here that we the proclaimer has a role in keeping a person engaged and interested in their faith. By providing 24/7 connection to the Church, we will support a person in their home and on their devices, in their faith while the local parish or church community walks with a person through this time of conversion.

Why Lent is a critical time to GO OUT

Even people with little faith understanding are more open to 'spiritual things,' at times of transition or in different seasons of life.

Transition times are when changes happen in a person's life such as graduation, a promotion, change in career, marriage, the birth of a child, retirement, moving house or even country, death of a loved one, a relationship disruption and the list goes on.

It is often in times of improvement or advancement in life that people ask questions about who they are and what they value and it is in these times that questions of faith arise.

The yearly seasons that come around of a new year, Christmas and Lent can be significant moments of questioning and a time of people being more open to faith and connecting to God.

WHAT IS CRITICAL

We don't have to force faith on people but just be present with a reason for our faith and be able to explain it in language, concepts and images that are accessible to the understanding of a person who possibly does not have a faith language, but feels a stirring within to ask the deeper questions of life. Lent is one of these critical seasons of the year when people are more open to God.

It is, therefore, one of the best times of the year for reaching people who are disconnected from Christ and the Church.

It is, for this reason, we create numerous different types of content in length and form that will appeal to different people.

We then distribute this proclamation content in over 600 ways and put it in as many places as possible so that people will come across it and by God's grace respond in their way.

This means it will be on television, as well as online in numerous ways with campaigns to bring people in so that they receive the content directly from us or they can see the content through social media directly.

As we connect with people, it will provide them with specifically created content such as video programs, podcasts, blogs etc.

It takes people of faith to Proclaim Christ in our modern and complex world. Reaching those we love with the message of the Church is an intentional activity. It requires us to be prayerful, thoughtful and well organised.

"Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved." But how are they to call on one in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in one of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone to proclaim him?

Section 4: The way we proclaim using media?

THE PROCLAMATION CYCLE

Proclamation in the modern world is complex and yet it is the key ingredient to Church health at the local level because when we engage in it, it brings vitality and life as people who are the evangelisers see conversion and for the evangelised, they experience coming to a new life. As the diagram below shows it is a process and a journey requiring both steps that need to be taken and most importantly time for this to occur.

Proclamation starts with a decision to go out and do it and most essentially deciding to understand and love those who will be reached. However, it is as much about the 'reacher,' or the proclaimer, as it is about the person being reached. Both experience conversion.

When using the Proclamation Cycle it becomes a repetitive cycle that builds momentum, that is self-funding and is income-generating for wider works of discipleship and evangelisation.

The Proclamation Cycle begins with what we call the initial Proclamation Spend.

CONTACT: The strategic spending of funds, to put the Proclamation content in its various forms, in places where people will come across it. This takes time and occurs in intense periods before the proclamation stage begins.

PROCLAMATION: This is the actual sharing of the message of the Gospel.

ENGAGEMENT: This is the period of time it takes a person to begin to 'really' listen. At first, people can be slow to allow the message to penetrate their minds and heart.



The critical elements in this process are time and sensitivity to what people are experiencing.

CONVERSION: These are the moments when a person begins to hear, believe and accept the love of Christ for themselves. On-going discipleship is part of the conversion process.

FINANCIAL RETURN: To reach people outside of the Church for Christ is very expensive. People inevitably realise this and freely and without pressure contribute to cover the costs.

PROCLAMATION RE-SPEND: Funds are put back into reaching more people and continuing the Proclamation Cycle.




THE CUMULATIVE EFFECT OF 2021

PROCLAMATION WORKS TOGETHER

To penetrate the modern world with all of its distractions and sophistication, we must present the Gospel message so that different aspects of the proclamation, when working together, will be seen and will be accessible to people who either are not connected to Church or who are feeling disconnected from the Church in some manner.



DIFFERENT WAYS

These are the different formats, whether visual, audio or print that the proclamation is done by. Some people are readers, others listen and others watch. Some are more emotive while others are more intellectual. Different ways are essential.

DIFFERENT PLACES

The Church sometimes develops different ways to proclaim the Gospel, only to communicate the details to their people who are already attending Church. We have to distribute the Gospel in different places such as television, radio, online, social media etc., so that it will be found by those not reading Church bulletins.

SAME TIME

To have the best chance of successfully reaching people outside the bubble of the Church, proclamation has to be done in multiple ways and in different places at the same time and for a sustained time. People need to come across it. For some people, just one exposure to the message is enough, but for most people today, it takes multiple exposures to the message for them to respond.

Doing all of this together, like links in a chain give strength to the Proclamation

GOING BEYOND THE BUBBLE













Our method of Proclaiming Christ, reaching people who do not attend Church or enriching the lives of those who do, starts with first FINDING THEM.


In business, this is called marketing and is both putting out the brand and a consistent message and then advertising, which is saying this is what is happening and inviting people in some way to participate in particular activities.

We start this process by creating advertisements about upcoming activities that people can respond by signing up to receive it or deciding to watch through various various media and social media platforms where we will put the content.

Additional to this, we know that many people can feel awkward talking about faith to family, friends and others but they want them to experience what they have in listening to our content. We, therefore, make the initial materials very simple, modern and contemporary and in formats that they can forward on and not have to discuss it they do not want to.

The secret is putting this message in places that people will come across. If they do not see it, they cannot respond to it as the Holy Spirit prompts them.

Going outside the bubble of Church to where the majority of people are requires a combination of activities all working in unison. As the Proclamation Circle showed this is the first step.

As a ministry, we conduct multiple small and large campaigns to Proclaim the Gospel. Each of these requires an initial start-up contribution.

Further funds are not required as the process funds itself into the future.

It is in this first step that we raise funds from donations.

The process of finding people to participate in these outreach campaigns is the most expensive part of the outreach process.

This can be done through television, social media, online and through the recommendation of others or through any way that will get the initial information in front of someone.

The way to attract a person is to speak to particular felt needs people face, a seasonal moment such as Lent or an interesting topic that catches a person's interest.

The content that is delivered must be compelling, explained in accessible language and literally take people by the hand and walk them into deeper faith.

People are not ignorant when it comes to how much an outreach like this costs to set up and maintain. We have spent \$5.8 million dollars setting up the ministry.

People fully expect to 350ntribute, but more to the point, they want to contribute because it is changing their lives and they do not want it to stop.

People reached by the ministry can contribute in multiple ways.

As an international ministry with audiences in over 142 countries, people can contribute in various currencies.

Our specially designed content delivery pages have options to give.

Phone numbers can be called in the USA and Australia 24 hours a day where someone will speak with you.

People fully expect to contribute, but more to the point, they want to contribute because it is changing their lives and they do not want it to stop.

***HOW TO REACH BEYOND THE CHURCH BUBBLE**











One of the most effective ways of reaching people is by putting the advertising content we produce on social media platforms. This is where many people come across it and engage with it privately at first. Essentially using Jesus' language, it is all about casting seeds that might land in fertile soil. As a ministry when we do cast seed beyond the bubble, the return is significant. There are a number of ways to do this.

The Evangelization diagram below starts with an initial spend that we call the 'Proclamation Spend' of \$100,000.

This pays for the advertisement to be shown 5,807,000 times. Each showing is called an Impression. A total of 2,389,712 people had the advertisement delivered to them meaning some people received it multiple times. From this, 88,496 people went to the web page to see what our advertisement was about. Of this 29,499 people began the journey to receive the content.

These are the number of people who agree to receive the proclamation content.

Proclamation Spend

The Proclamation Spend is the funds used to reach people where they are.

Unique People

Unique people are the number of individuals who have the invitation land in their social media account.

Impressions

Impressions are the number of times the invitation to participate will go out.

Page Visits


Page visits are the number of times people visit the landing page where they can sign up to receive the Proclamation content.

The Gideon 300 or G/300 are people who contribute a significant amount of money over the space of the year that allows the major works of the ministry to proceed.


